

Kalanchoe blossfeldiana



This popular variety of Kalanchoe will grow up to 12 inches wide, with fleshy green leaves.

Its small red, yellow, orange or pink flowers grow in clusters from autumn through to the spring, although some can be brought into flower at almost any time of the year. When the flowers start to fade or die, prune out the dying stems right down into the point where the flower stem emerges from the plant.

Keep new plant growth trimmed to develop a full compact bush.

Light: Sunny conditions for best leaf colour and good flowers.

Temperature: Average to warm temperatures with a minimum of 10° C (50° F).

Humidity: This plant will tolerate drier air and misting is not required for humidity.

Water: Water well when the plant is almost dry and then do not water next until the plant is almost dry again. In a warm, bright location this may be weekly; but in a lower light environment it may only be once every 3 weeks.

Feeding: Fertilize and or feed as per your plant supplier directions or refer to **Plants For All Cultural Practices file: [CP-NA ITFP-002](#)** (available via email from plantsforall@ody.ca)

Repotting: When plant roots have filled the pot, repot in the spring to the next larger pot size. Use a soil-less potting mix with good drainage.

Propagation: Take whole shoots or leaf cuttings in the spring or summer and dust them with hormone rooting powder and leave to dry for 3 days. Then lay them on fresh potting mix that is slightly dampened. After 3 weeks, roots should have started to form and can be watered.
